The day before the horrific attack in Norway, I had posted on my Facebook status that I was beginning to realize that I was related to everyone in Våler on either my great grandfather's side or my great grandmother's side.

I've always felt a deep, inexplicable link to Norway even though I was not born there. My genealogical research has only deepened the bond I feel to my ancestors and to the land that was their home.

I felt shock, anger and deep sadness over the attack on our friends and family in our

homeland. As I write this, I am still reeling from it all. Here was Norway, land of the Vikings, and of the resolute people who resisted and survived Nazi occupation, made the victim of the cowardly act of a single madman.

That this outrage occurred while our own heritage members were at Camp Trollfjel, is doubly incomprehensible to me. I can only hope that the Norwegian people's calm and purposeful response to this will serve as an example to our young people of the true strength of Norwegians.

Please join me on August 19th for a brief memorial for our friends and family followed by a presentation of our heritage campers telling us all about their experience. These campers are the fruit of our labor! Our fundraisers throughout the year help us fund scholarships for our heritage members to attend Camp Trollfjel, and help our young people grow into the future.

## A Bit of Freya Lodge History

As we all know, 2011 marks the 60th year of Freya Lodge's institution. In the months ahead we'll look back on some of the history that has helped form and shape our lodge.

After Freya Lodge was chartered with 105 members on November 17, 1951, their first annual Smørgåsbord was held in October of 1952 at the Veteran's Memorial Building in Santa Rosa. Over 500 people attended. By 1960



the event had grown to serve over 1000 people.

It was these and many other fundraisers that enabled the membership to buy the lot on West 9th in 1963 for \$8,148. Plans for construction of a

hall finally came to fruition in 1974, when a prefabricated building was delivered to the site and lodge members themselves began the task of assembling what is now Norway Hall.

The lodge moved into the new building January 1, 1975. A lot of people worked very hard to make Norway Hall a reality. Aren't we lucky they did?

Now is the time to start a project creating a work of art for the Folk Art Competition and Exhibition for the 2012 District 6 Convention to be held June 6 – 10 in Mesa, Arizona. That gives you almost a year to work on a project. I like to think of this part of the Convention as our Heritage Showcase.

Many people enter marathons knowing they won't come close to winning; but they enter the event, none-the-less. It is an accomplishment to simply finish the race. Likewise, it is an accomplishment to create traditional Norwegian Folk Art. Don't be discouraged because

you're not the best rosemaler, or an accomplished knitter, or weaver, or woodcarver. Enter your art or craft to showcase that you're learning, that you are progressing, and that you enjoy the art/craft and want to share your heritage with others. Promote this Convention Showcase of our heritage to your lodge, and encourage others to create and share. The categories for the Folk Art are: Rosemaling, Weaving (Norwegian design), Hardanger embroidery, Other traditional Needlework with a Norwegian theme, Hand Knitting (Norwegian design), Crocheting and Tatting, Figure Carving

(Norwegian motif), Relief Carving (Norwegian motif), Chip Carving, Bentwood, Other Woodcarving (Norwegian motif), and Other Media, including Photography, which has a Norwegian motif or theme.

Lodge Cultural Directors should give recognition to the Folk Art participants during a lodge meeting after the Convention. You might even want to have your own Lodge Showcase featuring the participants from your lodge.

## The New Oseberg Ship

Tønsberg, Norway is brimming with excitement this year with the recreation of one of the area's most famed Viking Age relics, the Oseberg ship. Originally discovered in a Viking burial mound in 1904, the original Oseberg ship is one of the most complete and well-preserved ships ever found. Researchers and volunteers are striving to not only recreate the ship with complete historical authenticity but to also answer some questions about the original use of the ship. Although seaworthy, it is believed that the original ship would have been frail and would have been used solely for coastal voyages, behaving much like Ragnar Thorseth's Oseberg replica

"Dronningen" that capsized during her maiden voyage after just 20 seconds. In preparation for the creation of the new replica, experts created model ships and tested them at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology. The findings lend credence to the theory that the original Oseberg ship may have been incorrectly assembled after the excavation in 1904.

With successful test models in hand, volunteers and boat builders are working hard in Tønsberg on the creation of the newest replica, setting the ship's keel and stem early this year. Utilizing historically accurate tools and materials, the ship is being crafted from a 150-

year-old oak tree, hand-made textiles and bolts and baleen. The ship's carvings will also be authentic and match the distinctive patterns of the original Oseberg ship. To learn more about the ship replica research or to track the building progress visit

SEPTEMBER 24/25, 2011

It is time to make your reservations for the adult (18 years and over) fall Rosemaling Seminar at Camp Norge. We will have three classes. The teachers are Julie Anne Droivold, Mardella Ivers, and Marley Wright Smith.

We will be painting on 12 inch heart-shaped plates. Julie Anne is teaching a Valdres design on a black background, teaching a few new flowers and sponging on the edge. Mardella Ivers will teach the Intermediates a Telemark Design on a medium blue background. Marley will teach the beginners class. She will be teaching a Telemark flower with scrolls around the border on a Norwegian Red and mid teal or Salem background. This will be good stroke practice. Look on the Camp Norge Website for pictures of all three projects: [www.Campnorge.com](http://www.Campnorge.com).

Please make your room reservation with me. I develop the list of who is in which room. You will pay for your room when you arrive at Camp. It is not included in your class fee. Bring your current membership card. Members pay \$16.20 per night; guests pay \$27.00 for dorms, which includes 8% Placer County Occupancy Tax. Only members are allowed to stay in the main house and the cozy cabins. For people who want to room together, I need to receive the list of names with the first reservation. RV's are encouraged as we have a limited number of beds. Members pay \$20 per night for up to four people per RV. Guests pay \$32 per night for RV's. Camp has electrical and water, but no sewer hookups. Tents are \$15 for up to four people for members, \$20 for non members. Pets are \$2 per night. Pets are not allowed in any of the buildings, pool area or sleeping rooms at any time. No occupancy tax on RV's or tents.

Please include your full phone number, address and lodge name and number when registering. If you have e-mail, please include your e-mail address. It is so much faster and cheaper if I need to talk to you. As soon as the supply lists are available from the teachers, I will send them as I receive your registration form and check. **ABSOLUTELY NO E-MAIL RESERVATION REQUESTS.** I need the check and registration form together. Be sure to send a self addressed stamped envelope for your supply list and class confirmation information if you do not have e-mail. I will not be sending you a supply list unless you send me a self-addressed, stamped envelope or your e-mail address with your registration form. I use Microsoft Word running on an XP program and all attachments will be attached from that program.

The cost of the seminar will be \$82 for registration which includes the class and wood piece all base coated and ready to go, hall rent and clean up, and the meals. There will be \$25 cancellation fee for any cancellations, but absolutely no cancellations after September 9th. Registration fees (less cancellation fee) can be refunded if you have to cancel up to September 9th if there is someone on the waiting list who wants your space. It is difficult for people on the waiting list to take your place if they do not have at least three weeks to make their plans, so please be thoughtful. Melanie Souza will again do our cooking. The cost for food for the weekend is included in the \$82 registration fee. The food includes breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturday and breakfast and lunch on Sunday. You were so very generous and cooperative with the cookies last time. I do so appreciate that. We will ask just one class to bring cookies, and will rotate those classes each time. The information will be in your supply list letter.

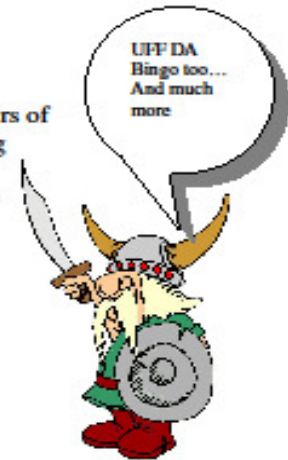

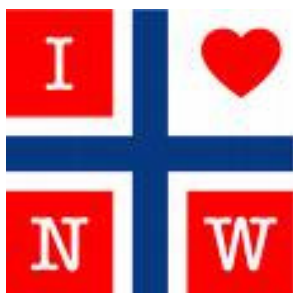
